Idaho Child Find

Some handicapped children are not in school. All school age children in Idaho have the right to a free public education. If you are the parent of a friend of a school-age handicapped child who is not enrolled in school or any educational program, call or write your local school district.

Service programs offer extensive help in the following areas:

Training for all exceptional children (school aged)

Speech and Hearing Therapy

Psychological Examinations

Counseling Services

Parent Training and Consultant Services

No two children are exactly the same. Every child is different. It is as hard to tell if you should be concerned about differences between children as it is hard to tell if a child is hard of hearing.

Most of the time there is nothing to worry about, but for one in every 100 children there will be a child related to a disability. That is when Child Find can help. Also, if you have a child ages 0-3 years old, who is not presently enrolled in school, and you feel the child may have a disability, please contact the school. They can provide you with disability screening information. If you know of a school aged handicapped child who is not receiving an education, call or write:
