PreK-12 Principal: Henry Filipponi Superintendent: Alan Felgenhauer Every decision we make is made with the best interests of the students' education, safety and overall well being in mind. That is our top priority. With those factors to consider, there will be a few changes for the upcoming year to help improve the educational environment and building safety here at the school. By outlining the changes now, everyone should know what to expect for the upcoming year.

Cell Phone Usage: The existing cell phone policy will be changed slightly to eliminate the use of cell phones during the passing period. Cell phone usage per policy is posted on our website in the Student Handbook.

Even though we are a small school, the three minutes allowed for changing classes does not allow for time to send and receive texts and calls. In practice, those calls and texts tend to spill over into class time, causing a distraction to the students and teachers. By eliminating the use of cell phones during instruction time and in passing, our hope is to maximize student learning and focus. Teacher discretion to allow cell phone use is no longer allowed. The only period during the day that cell phone use will be allowed is during lunch, after a student has left the cafeteria and reported to one of the staff supervised recreation areas. As always, if a parent needs to contact a student, please continue to utilize the established procedures by contacting the office.

Hats & Hoodies: Hats and hoodies being worn by our students have proven to be a distraction as well as an easy way to shield students' eyes from teachers when they are not focusing on the classroom material. By eliminating the distraction of hats and hoodies in the school building, we seek to create an environment of learning as well as prepare our students for entry into the professional world that awaits them.

Closed Campus: With the current events related to school safety across the nation, best practices for safety dictate that we control access to our building as much as possible. With this in mind, our campus will be closed for all students during the lunch period. Students may still leave through the normal check out process. Any parent who wants their student to leave campus on a daily basis without going through a daily check out process, may sign a form which will be kept on file in the office.

These three rule changes are being implemented with the intent of improving the educational environment for our students and staff so that we can get down to the business of learning. These have been difficult choices to make but I am confident that over time, we will reap great rewards in student achievement and happiness.

Changes to Facility: If you have been by the school recently, you might have noticed the window tinting that has been applied to the main entry doors as well as the doors to the cafeteria. This was done to enhance student safety by limiting outside visibility and allowing staff to detect any potential threats without being seen themselves. The exterior doors will remain locked during the school day and all visitors are asked to enter through the main office doors. There you will find an intercom system inside the entryway where you will speak with office staff and be let into the building. This security measure is put into place to enhance student safety as much as possible.

School Lunch Program- As the free meals for all program expires this year, we will have to make sure that all families who qualify for free and reduced meals fill out the required form. If you have previously qualified or think that your family would qualify, please make sure and fill out the form to avoid paying full price for your students meals. As a reminder, there is no charging of meals allowed so please act fast to avoid paying more than needed.

I hope all of our students and staff have a great year! We look forward to seeing you August 17th from noon to 7 p.m. for registration and August 22nd for the first day of an amazing school year!

Applications Required for Free and Reduced Meals for 2022-2023 School Year

This year, families who need assistance paying for school meals will be required to submit an application for free and reduced price meals for the first time since 2020. The change comes with Congress' passing of the \$3 billion Keep Kids Fed Act, which reinstates a requirement that low-income students who fall above the poverty line apply to receive a free or reduced price for school meals. Previously during the pandemic, the full price of meals was covered for all students, and no application was required.

Idaho Child Find

Some handicapped children are not in school. All school age children in Idaho have the right to a free public education. If you are the parent of a friend of a school-age handicapped child who is not enrolled in school or any educational program, call or write your local school district. Service programs offer extensive help in the following areas:

- Training for all exceptional children (school aged)
- · Speech and Hearing Therapy
- · Psychological Examinations
- Counseling Services
- Parent Training and Consultant Services

No two children are exactly the same. Every child is different, that's why it is sometimes hard to tell if you should be concerned about differences between children who are the same age.

Most of the time there is nothing to worry about, but for one in ten, the differences can be related to a disability. That is when Child Find can help. Also, if you have an infant or child ages 0-3 years old, who is not presently enrolled in school, and you feel the child may have a disability, please contact the school. They can provide you with disability screening information. If you know of a school aged handicapped child who is not receiving an education, call or write:


